CSUN NCOD John Bulwer Award

The John Bulwer Award is presented to an individual or organization that "dares to be different." The Award commemorates a 17th Century pioneer in the field of language and rhetoric. John Bulwer (fl. 1646) was one of the earliest writers dealing with Sign Communication. His two germinal treatises, *Chirologia: or the Natural Language of the Hand and Chironomia: or the Art of Manual Rhetoric* (1644) have exerted an influence on playwrights and authors for more than three hundred years.

Criteria: Innovation or Breaking out of the Box in any Field

CSUN NCOD Daniel T. Cloud Award

Daniel T. Cloud (1900-1962) was one of the greatest early leaders in the field of education of deaf students in the United States. The Award was established in 1967 by the National Leadership Training Program at the California State University, Northridge, to honor his memory, vision, and remarkable contributions in furthering deaf education.

Criteria: Exemplary leadership in Education, Human Services and/or Community

CSUN NCOD Dr. Lawrence R. Fleischer Distinguished Service Award

Dr. Lawrence R. Fleischer (1945-2009) was an extraordinary visionary, educator and leader, well known and respected locally, nationally and internationally. The Lawrence Fleischer Distinguished Service to the Deaf Award is given in recognition of those organizations or individuals whose work contributes significantly to improving the lives of people who are deaf or hard of hearing. Recipients can either be well known leaders in the field or those who work behind the scenes and whose efforts are often unseen and unsung.

Criteria: Commitment to Enhancing Lives or Community
