In this presentation, Dr. Cuellar will review emerging scholarship on Minority Serving Institutions (MSIs), with a focus on Hispanic Serving Institutions (HSIs). She will also discuss how institutions can engage in a process of organizational learning to better serve an increasingly diverse student population.
