

- Healthcare is the largest industry in the U.S., and the second largest employer, with more than 11 million jobs.
- Virtually all new private sector jobs over the past 5 years came from healthcare; and the sector continues to grow faster than most other segments[1]

- In addition to more traditional careers in healthcare management, graduates work in many other areas including: pharmaceutical companies, health insurance companies, management consulting, longterm care facilities, professional societies, like American College of Healthcare Executives (ACHE.org) and state and Federal agencies.
