# **Why Did We Create This Innovation?**

## **Inspiration**

\*We heard a number of challenges with the required 1-unit PSY 301 course, which is required of all 2800 Psychology majors, and we aimed to create an engaging online course to address these challenges.

### Goals

- The goals of this project were:
- · To reduce the bottleneck for this course -to offer enough seats for juniors in our large major each semester by bringing the course fully online
- · To design a highly engaging online class delivered by tenure-track faculty at an earlier stage in students' education.
- · To provide updated, relevant, and standardized content to all students entering the Psychology major to facilitate their progress through and achievement in the Psychology major.


## Closing the Achievement Gap

- Allowing students to take the course earlier. when it is most beneficial to their education
- \*Revised content includes proactive instruction on how to complete the major, including sections focusing on advisement, curriculum options, and planning for graduate school
- The Tips For Success section of the course includes tips from CSUN Psych faculty on various topics such (e.g., how to email your professors), how to get into a research lab how to write a thank vou note etc.)



- \*Providing access to most of the tenure-track Psychology faculty through videos and course resources, regardless of instructor of record for the course
- . Designing an engaging way to deliver the content of this course is particularly valuable to our least prepared students, thus reducing the achievement gap

# What is the Innovation?



## The Details

- \*WHO? Dr. Malmberg & Dr. Fahmie, Department of Psychology
- · Support from Faculty Technology Center, CSBS Dean Theodoulou, Dr. Razani, Chair of Psychology Dept.
- \*WHAT? PSY 301 is a 1-unit, junior-level course. The three primary goals of the course are: 1) to introduce students to Psychology major requirements and how to best navigate their options in the major, 2) to describe various career options at the Bachelor's, Masters, and doctoral levels in psychology and related fields, and 3) to prepare students to apply for graduate programs and jobs
- \*HOW? We polled faculty on the content to address in the course, recruited their participation in the videos, and designed an online course unique to the Psych major.



# **What Impact Does the Innovation Have on the Achievement Gap?**
