The ACT Residency Program May Be For You!



The ACT residency program is an accelerated, twosemester preliminary credential program that focuses on addressing the diverse needs of urban school learners. Candidates progress through this full-time program as a cohort, completing fieldwork during the day and coursework in the late afternoon and evening. The program is a combination of online, hybrid, and in-person courses. The ACT Program incorporates neurodevelopmental methodology, an innovative and research-based educational approach in addressing the unique and diverse needs of K-12 students in urban schools. Special education candidates may serve as substitute teachers in LAUSD schools while participating in ACT, supplementing their field experiences and income.

ACT Program Components

- Core Courses: Two courses, completed by general and special education candidates, that focus on foundational knowledge and skills for teachers serving diverse urban learners
- **Specialization Courses:** Classes each semester that target appropriate specialization areas
- Fieldwork: Classroom assignments with experienced mentor teachers that increase in duration and intensity
