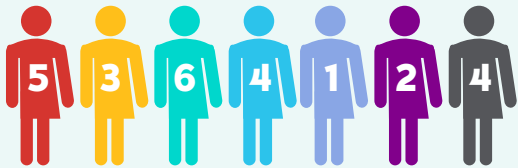

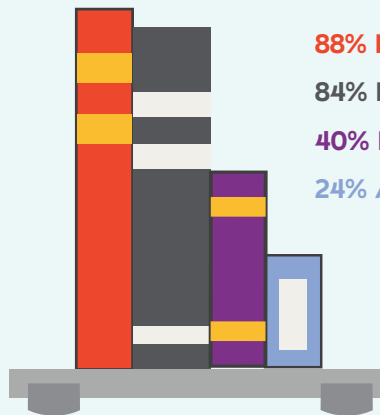

NUMBER OF STUDENTS ENROLLED BY COLLEGE



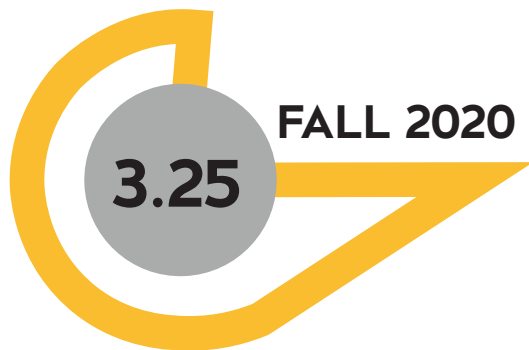

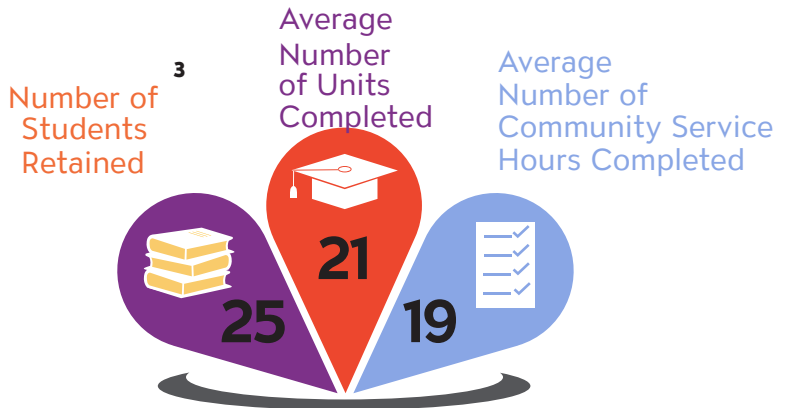

- 24% Attaining Sophomore Status

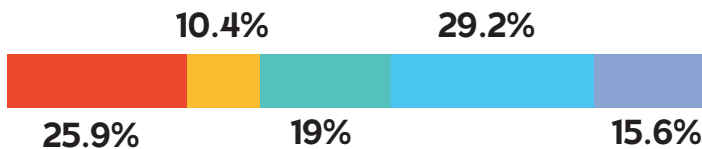
AVERAGE SCHOLAR GPA

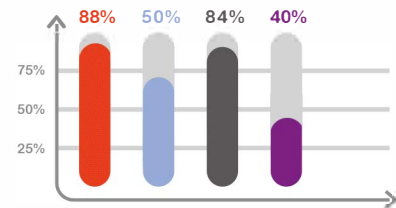

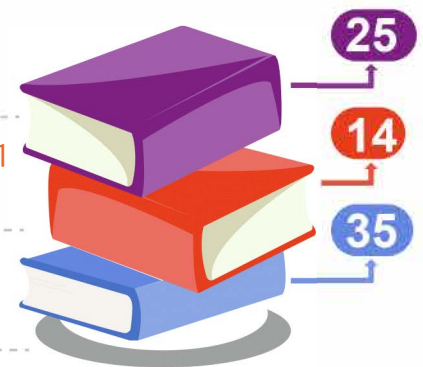

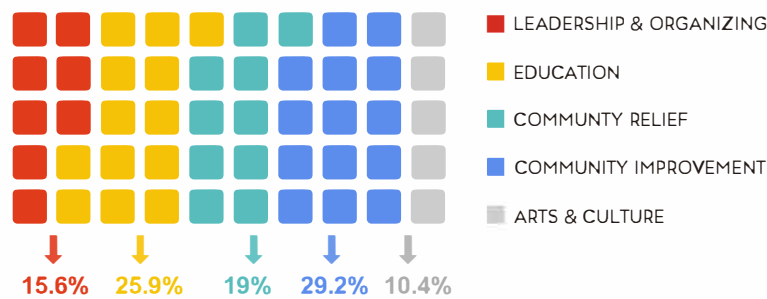
Number of Students⁴ Retained at CSUN
