




Featuring the Elementary Education Credential Program

Did You Know That...

The Department of Elementary Education placed 257 credential candidates in field assignments during the 2019-2020 academic year (128 Fall 2019 and 129 Spring 2020). These candidates participated in four credential pathways: part- or full-time traditional (TRAD) program, 1-year full-time cohort-based Accelerated Collaborative Teacher (ACT) Program, 2-year Intern Program for on-the-job teachers, or the undergraduate Integrated Teacher Education Program (ITEP).
