SUMMARY:

Under general supervision, the Education Specialist will provide specialized academic instruction utilizing appropriate strategies to Preschool age children who have disabilities – including cognitive, social/emotional, language, or physical – and qualify for special education services.

ESSENTIAL DUTIES & RESPONSIBILITIES:

- Familiar with early childhood developmental stages.
- Familiar with early childhood social development.
- Familiar with early childhood language development.

- Familiar with State Preschool assessments.
- Plan, design, and implement a comprehensive standards-based instructional program.
- Provide students with specialized instruction based on their unique needs resulting from their identified disabilities.
- Act as case manager/carrier for assigned students.
- Assess students and write individual educational plans (IEPs) to meet the individual student needs.
- Monitors individual student's progress utilizing data that reflects student performance on his or her IEP goals; adjusts instruction as needed based on analysis of the data.
- Collaborates and schedules IEP meetings with required members.
- Participate as a member of the IEP team and provide input to the IEP Goals.
- Collaborate with other teachers and facilitate the integration of students into general education classes. Monitor student progress and the overall effectiveness of the integration models.
- Understand and relate to students with special needs assuring the proper implementation of educational programs
 including designing and implementing appropriated behavior management techniques for use in instructional and
 disciplinary purposes.
- Writes and implements effective behavior plans for students
- Prepare all necessary reports and maintain educational records required and necessary to provide a quality educational program.
- Understand principles and practices related to instruction and program development for young children with Autism and developmental disabilities.
- Establish and maintain cooperative and effective working relationships with parents, general education teachers, and other service providers or agencies.

- Communicate effectively with parents, team members, staff, and agency representatives.
- Demonstrates knowledge of special education laws as well as SELPA and District policies and procedures.
- Participate in professional development and maintain a high level of professional competence.
- Establishes and maintains a safe, orderly, and child centered classroom environment.
- If assigned to an Itinerant position the employee will be required to drive frequently for department business.

QUALIFICATIONS:

- Possess a valid California or out-of-state Education Specialist Credential: Early Childhood Special Education Required
- Mild/Moderate and/or Moderate/Severe disabilities authorization Preferred
- Autism Spectrum Disorders authorization Preferred
- Possess an English Language Learner certificate Required
- Have knowledge of child developmental stages Required
- Bilingual: Spanish Preferred

DESCRIPTION OF PHYSICAL REQUIREMENTS:

- Position requires normal physical strength and endurance for standing, sitting, bending, and walking. Position may
 require sitting or standing for extended periods of time, for example when working at a desk, conference table, small
 student classroom table, or in meetings in various configurations.
- Vision sufficient to read printed materials; hearing and speech sufficient to conduct normal in-person and telephone conversations.
- Work assignments are normally located in a work environment with light physical activity and require light physical
 effort.
- May require lifting 25 pounds maximum or carrying any object weighing over 15 pounds.

SALARY AND BENEFITS:

The entry-level range on the 2017 – 2018 Certificated Salary Schedule is \$47,475 – \$67,374, with an additional amount of \$1,732 granted annually for each post Baccalaureate degree. The benefits include subsidized Medical/Prescription, Dental, and Vision for employee and family, plus Life Insurance (for employee only).
