














CSUN ENROLLMENT PRESENT: APPLICATIONS, ADMITS, ENROLLMENTS: 2019-2022

- Decreased significantly since pandemic began
- CCC enrollment dropped below 2 million headcount for Fall 2020
 - First-time in three decades
 - CCC have challenges with data reporting







Governor's budget includes CSU resident enrollment growth of 2.5% (9,434 FTES)




Budget compact commits to an additional 1% enrollment growth of through 2026-27
