DIRECTOR'S NOTE

Who or what is UNDINE. Yes, what! Undine (sometimes spelt Ondine) is an elemental being associated with water. Undines are not human in that they lack a soul. Undines as creatures are referenced or appear extensively in mythology and literature. Water nymphs, sirens, selkies and mermaids are all undines, the most well known to us are *The Little Mermaid* (Andersen/Disney) and *Moby Dick* (through the Starbucks mermaid). Undines are female and must marry a human in order to gain a soul. A husband disloyal to an Undine faces destruction. Undine/human offspring have a soul but also have some kind of aquatic trait. Undine is also a disease known as Undine's Curse, which affects the individual's ability to breathe, causing hyperventilation similar to the experience of a panic attack. Much of this I was unaware of until well into FABULATION rehearsals.

I had instinctively begun looking at breath as a motif. Actors created 'breath gestures' which we use in ensemble sequences and silhouettes. They do in-depth work with breath in preparation for performance. I, as a theatre artists, frequently work with actors' breath, as a recurrent cycle of inspiration and expiration, with the potential to release creative power and engage imagination.

I have been interested in breath in the production sound-score, as well as, not unlike *THE LITTLE MERMAID*, water. The literary Undine whose name Sharona Watkins adopts, is also a social climber who uses marriage for social advancement. The play is a richly nuanced and boldly exaggerated journey of downfall and redemption. I am happy to have had the opportunity to 'fabulate', with a skillful team of students and professionals, our version of Lynn Nottage's *FABULATION*.
