

Teacher Credential Candidate Student Teaching Assignments in 2017-18 Did You Know That...



Northridge Academy High School (NAHS), in the Los Angeles Unified School District (LAUSD), was founded in partnership with California State University, Northridge (CSUN) in 2004. Located on the CSUN campus, NAHS plays a vital role in training credential candidates; CSUN consistently assigns student teachers to NAHS each semester and holds professional development sessions for current teachers.

In 2017-18, there were 17 CSUN secondary education student teachers assigned to NAHS in a variety of subject areas and teacher preparation pathways as shown below.
