

Main finding


One third of our FTF come from 25 high schools located in the San Fernando Valley and West Los Angeles. Schools belong to three different school districts: LAUSD, Burbank Unified, and Glendale Unified.

Top 25: 2014-2018

Over the last five years, the total numbers of students coming from the top 25 feeders has been very stable with rates that ranged from 29.9% in 2014 to 33.4% in 2018.




What high schools do our students come from?



Median Household

Median household incomes in the top 25 feeders' areas range from \$41,660 to \$100,323. Half of the high school feeders to CSUN are located in areas with household incomes below the median for LA county which is \$61,015.
