Scorched, the English language version of Incendies, received its world premiere in 2007 in a coproduction by Canada's National Arts Centre English Theatre (Ottawa) and Tarragon Theatre (Toronto).

DIRECTOR'S NOTE

SCORCHED: THE PLAY, THE PLAYWRIGHT, THE PRODUCTION

The plot of *Scorched* begins in Canada and invites two characters, a twin brother and sister, to embark upon a journey (with the audience) to solve the mystery of their own family. This family, it turns out, has been fractured by war. The mother, Nawal, is modeled closely on the plight of political activist, Soha Bechara. As with most wars, there is no victory, only loss. As with most wars the main victims are the women and the children. The playwright himself arrived in Canada as a child refugee from the country of his birth. Wajdi Mouawad chose to set the war in *Scorched* in an unnamed, desert country. The story of wars in the Middle East is long and unending, their individual histories a complex knot of violence, instigated by various loyalties and hostilities and too often suppressed so the cycles of conflict resurge in the next generation. In *Scorched*, the details of the war is less important than the details of what has been lost. I have felt an urgent desire as director for the story of this play to be told.

I had vivid images for the style of setting and a strong impulse to invite the audience to not be as we are, sitting comfortably distant, but to be embedded in the action, like a journalist in war, as witness and voice to action. I have been lucky to have a team of extremely capable and courageous designers and to have cast a group of extremely talented emerging actors. This is not a play that I can invite you to 'enjoy.' But I do invite response, physical and emotional.




