





## **Featuring the Special Education Credential Program**

## Did You Know That...

The Department of Special Education placed 264 credential candidates in field assignments during the 2018-2019 academic year (128 Fall 2018, 115 Spring 2019, and 21 Summer 2019). These candidates participated in three credential pathways: part- or full-time traditional (TRAD) program, 1-year full-time cohort-based Accelerated Collaborative Teacher (ACT) Program, or 2-year Intern Program for on-the-job teachers.
