

# ABOUT SSSLP

The CSUN Social Skills for Little Learners Program (SSSLP) is a center-based program that is designed to serve the social needs of families and children from three to five years of age. CSUN-SSSLP serves children who have been identified by Regional Center or other community members as having a developmental delay in social skills, or who are at-risk for delay. The program works with the family to not only address the child's social-emotional skills, but also higher developmental needs in motor, cognitive, communication and sensory to help them prepare for TK or Kindergarten. The program's professional staff consists of a licensed Speech-Language Pathologists, clinic assistants and an Early Start Program Coordinator. They work as a collaborative team to address the needs of the whole child

## OPENING & CLOSING CIRCLE

The beginning and ending of each meeting will always include an opening and closing circle. This opening and closing activity gives the child an opportunity to meet new peers, express themselves and socialize in a way that is commonly practiced in the early years of Primary School.



## FIELDTRIPS & EVENTS

The children of SLLP will get to participate in fieldtrips and events throughout the year such as day trips to CSUN's duck pond, play centers, as well as engaging in themed days such as pajama day, crazy hair day & much more!



## SNACK

Children are provided with a snack each time the program meets. In addition to providing a nutritional break, it is a time where age-appropriate social skills can be exercised.



## OUTSIDE PLAY

Outside play is a fun opportunity for children to develop their motor, social and communication skills. The children are encouraged to practice appropriate social skills such as lining up in order, bubble space, socializing with their peers, engage in fun and age-appropriate activities in our play area designed just for them!



## MOTOR

Motor skills are an essential part of development for the whole child. Children receive all motor developmental benefits throughout the program. Motor development is strengthened through play and group activities to help them prepare for Primary School. As the child continues to mature, movement and physical interactions with people and objects remain powerful.



## INDOOR CREATIVE PLAY

In the playroom, children experience creative activities focused on social-emotional and cognitive growth, while also practicing appropriate social skills. Activities include imaginative play, art, building blocks, use of sensory materials (i.e. scissors, crayons, play dough), story time, getting messy and cleaning up. Exposing the child to these activities will help them become familiarized to the everyday materials and activities that are given in Primary School. In this program, children build their social skills through child directed exploration with adult guidance.
