Common Numbered Notes

- 9900 Restricted to students scoring 147 or higher on the English Placement Test (EPT). Advisement required. A one-semester writing course for GE and degree credit. *Effective Fall 2018, the EPT Exam has been replaced with Multiple Measures Assessment.
- 9901 The first course in a two-semester freshman writing experience for GE and degree credit. Advisement required.
- 9902 The second course in a two-semester freshman writing experience for GE and degree credit.

 Prerequisite: Completion of 114A.
- 9903 The first course in a two-semester freshman writing experience for GE and degree credit. Lecture 113A must be taken with lab UNIV 61. See notes for details. Enter both classes in your cart before you finish enrolling.
- 9904 The second course in a two-semester freshman writing experience for GE and degree credit. Lecture 113B must be taken with lab UNIV 62. See notes for details. Enter both classes in your cart before you finish enrolling.
- 9905 Restricted to freshmen.
- 9906 Restricted to sophomores.
- 9907 Restricted to juniors.
- 9908 Restricted to seniors.
- 9909 Restricted to graduate students.
- 9910 This class is reserved for new transfer students only.
- 9911 Restricted to EOP students.
- 9912 Restricted to juniors and seniors.
- 9913 Restricted to juniors, seniors and graduate students.
- 9914 Restricted to seniors and graduate students.
- 9915 Restricted to students in the University GE Honors program.
- 9916 Restricted to Liberal Studies ITEP freshmen.
- 9917 Restricted to Liberal Studies ITEP juniors.

- 9918 Restricted to Liberal Studies ITEP freshmen and juniors.
- 9919 Restricted to Liberal Studies majors.
- 9920 A grade of Required Progress (RP) in ESM courses DOES NOT qualify students for improved placement in GE or Dev. Math.
- 9921 To receive a grade of Required Progress (RP) in ESM courses, students complete prescribed tasks but are NOT required to qualify for improved placement in GE or Dev. Math.
- 9922 For optional improved placement in GE or Dev.

 Math, students must receive Credit (CR) in an ESM course; this includes a proctored final assessment.
- 9923 Class restricted to only Deaf Students.
- 9924 A GE Path Course. GE Paths are groupings of General Education course options that provide an in-depth exploration of a theme and a specific set of related learning outcomes. Students may opt to take multiple GE path courses to provide emphasis to their GE coursework. Learn more at www.csun.edu/qepaths.
- 9925 A community-based (service learning) experience is attached to the course content. Your instructor will provide hands-on experiences that will bond course content to community service.
- 9926 This accelerated class is taught in a condensed format of fewer than 16 weeks.
- 9927 Concurrent enrollment required in laboratory, field studies, and/or workshop.
- 9928 Consult catalog course description for information regarding prerequisites, special requirements, or eligibility for this class.
- 9929 Enrollment is subject to proof of completion of requisites in the current catalog. Present proof by means of a grade slip, transcript or grad check to the instructor at the FIRST CLASS MEETING. Students without proof will be asked to drop the class.

- 9930 This section available on a CR/NC basis only.
- 9931 This class requires participating students to use an Apple iPad using iOS 9 or later. Recommended models include the iPad Air, iPad Pro, 4th generation iPad with Retina Display or the iPad Mini 2 or newer. Visit www.csun.edu/mycsuntablet to learn more.
- 9932 Additional hours assigned or arranged.
- 9933 Enrollment is restricted to students who have been admitted to CSUN for the fall semester.
- 9934 ESM 196QR is for students whose only CSUN math class will be Math 140: Introductory Statistics. STEM and Business majors should take ESM 099 or other ESM options.
- 9935 To satisfy the ESM requirement, students must earn a grade of Credit (CR) or Required Progress (RP) in an ESM course.
- 9936 This course is reserved for CSUN Community College concurrent enrollment program.
- 9937 Restricted course. Department consent required to add the class.
- 9938 Restricted course. Instructor consent required to add the class.
- 9939 Field work required. Additional hours assigned or arranged.
- 9940 A few seats in this class are reserved for students eligible to enroll at CSUN through the CSU CourseMatch program.
- 9948 The first course in a two-semester statistics/quantitative reasoning pathway experience.
- 9949 The second course in a two-semester statistics/quantitative reasoning pathway experience.
- 9950 Wait list is not available for this corequisite course.
- 9951 The SOLAR wait list is not available for this corequisite course. Contact the department for wait listing options.
- 9960 UNIV 60, Supplemental Instruction (SI), is a one unit, CR/NC, peer-facilitated study group class designed to help students master the challenging content material of this course. Find out more, go to www.csun.edu/Irc or call the Learning Resource Center at (818) 677-2033.

- 9961 Students enrolling in any section of AAS 113AOP, AFRS 113AOP, CH S 113AOP, or QS 113AOP must also enroll in UNIV 61EOP lab.
- 9962 Students enrolling in any section of AAS 113BOP, AFRS 113BOP, CH S 113BOP, or QS 113BOP must also enroll in UNIV 62EOP lab.
- 9970 Restricted to freshman students with majors in the Mike Curb College of Arts, Media, and Communication.
- 9971 Restricted to freshman student athletes.
- 9972 Restricted to Exploratory freshman students.
- 9973 Restricted to NCOD and Deaf Studies freshman students.
- 9974 This class is part of the nine-unit Child & Adolescent Development Freshman Connection. See your advisor before registering.
- 9975 This class is part of the five-unit Family & Consumer Sciences Freshman Connection. See your advisor before registering.
- 9976 This class is part of the six-unit Health Careers Freshman Connection. See your advisor before registering.
- 9977 This class is part of the six-unit College of Humanities Freshman Connection. See your advisor before registering.
- 9978 This class is part of the six-unit Kinesiology Freshman Connection . See your advisor before registering.
- 9979 This class is part of the eight-unit Math Freshman Connection. See your advisor before registering.
- 9980 This class is part of the six-unit Social & Behavior Sciences Freshman Connection. See your advisor before registering.
- 9981 This class is part of the six-unit Exploratory Students Freshman Connection. See your advisor before registering.
- 9982 This class is part of a six-unit cluster and is restricted to Freshman Connection students only. See your advisor before registering.
- 9983 This class is part of the six-unit David Nazarian College of Business & Economics Freshman Connection. See your advisor before registering.
- 9984 This class is part of the six-unit Anthropology Learning Community. See your advisor before registering.

- 9985 Restricted to EOP FreshStart students.
- 9986 This section is designed to provide specific academic and social support for Black students.
- 9990 This course has seats reserved for First Time Freshmen. Students other than First Time Freshmen may use the Wait List functionality if all unreserved seats are full.
- 9991 This course is taught in a hybrid-flexible format with some students in the classroom and some students on line at the same time. Additional technology may be needed for online participation. Please consult the faculty member for details about meeting patterns and location.
- 9993 This class may have an on-campus requirement. If you enroll in this class and the course is approved for on-campus meetings, you will be expected to come to campus as scheduled. All classes with proposed on-campus meetings are currently under review by CSUN and the CSU system. You will be notified via your CSUN email whether the course has been approved for on-campus meetings. We expect the approval process to be completed about one month before classes begin. - 9994 COI: This is a Campus Online class (COI) in which most class sessions are presented in an online environment with intermittent face-to-face meetings for activities such as labs, special in-class presentations, exams, or other in-class proofs of competency. Online meetings may be a mix of scheduled meeting times and anytime access. Please consult with professor for details.

- 9995 FOI: This is a Fully Online class (FOI) in which all class sessions and exams are presented in an online environment. FOI courses have no on campus meetings. Online meetings may be a mix of scheduled and/or intermittent meeting times, and anytime access. Please consult with professor for details.
- 9996 This online class requires on-campus meeting(s). Contact instructor for details.
- 9997 This is a Hybrid class (OH) in which students attend class sessions on campus and in an online environment. The class typically meets approximately half online and half on campus.
- 9998 This is a Campus Online class (OC/COA/COS) in which most class sessions are presented in an online environment. Any face-to-face meetings are usually for activities such as orientation, special inclass presentations, exams, or other in-class proofs of competency.
- 9999 This is a Fully Online class (OF/FOA/FOS) in which all class sessions and exams are presented in an online environment. OF courses have no on campus meetings.
