-This Includes mental health services + nurses and counselors at schools.








To implement the whole child approach for long-term success, schools use COLLABORATION, COORDINATION, and INTEGRATION.

ENGAGED

Integration: School policies and professional development plans provide meaningful participation in decision making for students, families, staff and communities. Student and staff input is especially helpful for monitoring progress and making needed changes in a timely manner.



SAFE

Collaborate: Our school provides our students, staff, and family members with regular opportunities for learning and support in teaching students how to manage their own behavior, and reinforcing expectations, rules, and routines.

Coordination: A safe school environment monitors a place where students are emotionally safe, where students feel a sense of belonging, welcomed, and cared for; a place that validates and respects students and staff from all backgrounds and in whatever ways they identify: race, ethnicity, gender, native language, sexual orientation, religion, ability, and more.



Integration: Schools ensure that critical skills are emphasized: problem-solving, technoliteracy, citizenship, global perspectives, etc.; schools constantly monitor and assess effectiveness and relevance of programs to long-term success and citizenship; cross- and extracurricular activities challenging students' academic and personal growth are supported by schools and



Coordination: Schools actively work with families to understand necessary skills for long-term success; schools work with curriculum providers and textbook publishers to ensure that relevant, challenging material is presented in all grades; schools collaborate with families to ensure individual students are appropriately challenged.
